

COVID-19 Update for On-Farm Service Providers

March 26, 2020

For service providers that have chosen to continue offering services to Ontario sheep farmers during this pandemic, a reminder of some steps you can take to minimize the risks of COVID-19.

- Cancel appointments if you have any symptoms of COVID-19, been in contact with someone who has COVID-19, or you've have travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days
- Call ahead to do a risk assessment. Postpone going to the farm if yes is the answer to ANY of the following questions.
 - Has anyone on the farm has been exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 (cough, fever, shortness of breath).
 - Has anyone on the farm has travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days.
 - Has anyone on the farm is in one of the "higher risk" categories for complications from COVID-19 (65 years of age of older, compromised immune system, or with underlying health condition).
- Continue to be diligent on biosecurity measures you take on-farm, and between farms.
- Maintain social distancing (at least 2 metres/ 6 feet) while on-farm where possible.
 - Can you complete the required work on your own?
 - If help is needed, what steps can be taken to maintain social distancing?
 - Where social distancing cannot be maintained, what steps can you take to protect yourself and those working with you?
- Meals / breaks
 - Bring your own meals or arrange to have a packaged lunch set out for you.
 - Avoid going into the farmhouse.
 - Have a means to wash/sanitise your hands.
- Look after yourself
 - If the job can be postponed, consider doing so.
 - If you aren't already, consider keeping a daily log of everyone you are in contact with.
