During these challenging and continually changing times of the Covid-19 pandemic, all of us, staff, management, board directors and members of Northumberlamb will need to follow best practices to keep our staff, on-site CFIA staff, and our customers safe.

It will be necessary to follow all government health recommendations. As a food provider, we are a designated essential service and, as such, will continue to operate.

The Nova Scotia Health Authority recommends that when possible, workers should work from home, therefor Geoff and Micheal will be working remotely for the time being.

Those that cannot work from home must follow best practices to keep themselves and everyone else safe. That would include as much hand washing as possible: a minimum of each time you enter or exit the plant, at lunch, break times, and anytime you change work stations. Additionally, we must maintain social distancing, meaning keeping two meters (six feet) apart from each other at all times, which includes during breaks, lunch, and after work. I know this is an adjustment and may disrupt regular tasks, but please have patience while your coworkers adapt to the new normal.

Anyone who is experiencing symptoms (fever, tiredness and dry cough) must stay home and self-isolate. If anyone in your home is experiencing symptoms, you should also stay home. The federal government has announced changes in EI that would make someone self-isolating eligible for EI benefits.
