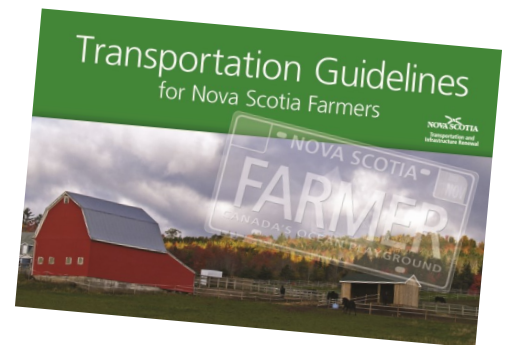
Road Safety Info Sessions

Condition 15 – allows you to haul a trailer over 4,500kg with a truck or tractor. The combination vehicle weight is restricted based on your license class:

Class 5 + 15 – combined vehicle weight up to 14,000kg

Class 3 + 15 – combined vehicle weight can be over 14,000kg

Condition 23 – allows you to haul a tractor and implement (over 4,500kg) and combination weight over 14,000kg. Applies to tractor combination only.

Note: Condition 23 requires a medical

Tractor Safety Course

April 21 and 22 at Dalhousie Agricultural Campus (Cost: \$225 + HST)

Delivered in partnership with Extended Learning, this course is designed to increase awareness and test competency of tractor operators with regards to safe operation and use of farm tractors and implements. Course is intended for:

- ◆ 14-16 year olds with a valid Nova Scotia Class 8 driver's license who want to be able to haul equipment on Nova Scotia roads (combined weight less than 14,000kg) and,
- ◆ Others who have a valid class 5 driver's license and want to increase their tractor safety knowledge and skills.
